Selected quality papers shall be considered for publication in the selected journals (Scopus, SCI Indexed, UGC Care Listed and peer-reviewed journals). Some articles may also be

published in an Edited Book (ISBN) from a reputed international publisher (Having branched abroad). The publication of a paper will be subject to the referees' decision and submission of a copyright agreement and zero plagiarism report.

Conference Fee
