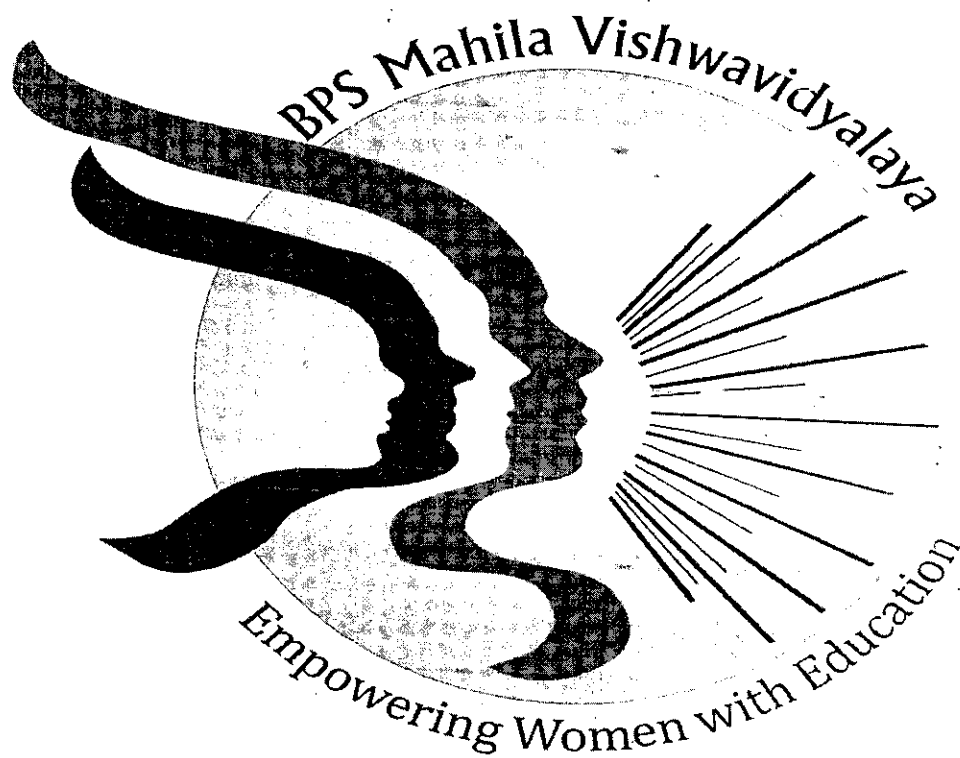

To confirm the Minutes of the 23rd meeting of the Academic Council held on 19/02/2021 (**Annexure-1, page - 15**).
- 2. Follow up Action Report.**
To note the action report on the decisions taken by the Academic Council in its 23rd meeting held on 19/02/2021 (**Annexure-2, page- 16-18A**).
- 3. To note the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in approving the case to start LL.M two years programme in the Department of Laws from the Academic Session 2021-22.**

Statement of case:-

At present the Department of Laws is running one year programme w.e.f. 2013. The Department of Laws is intending to switch over to LL.M Two years programme in place of one year programme. Certain conditions, regarding staff in UGC guidelines for introduction of one year LLM, 2012 were prescribed for one year LLM course which are never met by DOL in our University. BCI mandated at least four Associate Professor in the Department exclusively for One year LLM programme (Rule 5.1) of the said guidelines, additionally, the new BCI guidelines only allow to run Two years LLM programme.

Accordingly, considering the above rule and position the case to start LLM two programme was placed and approved in the meeting of DSC, PGBOS and Faculty (**Annexure-3, page-19-24**). The scheme, syllabi and Ordinance has also been approved by the aforesaid bodies. (**Annexure-4, page-25-89**). The case was submitted to the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor who after due consideration approved the same in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council and further to place the same before the Academic Council in its ensuing meeting for information.

4. To consider the recommendations made by the Fee Concession Committee held on 13/04/2021 under the convenership of the Dean Students Welfare.

Statement of the Case:-

At present there is no policy for grant of fee concession to the poor and needy students. Every year many requests are received from all departments for grant of fee concession to poor and needy students. The case was put up to the Vice-Chancellor and then the Vice-Chancellor had constituted a Committee to frame the policy and guidelines for grant of concession to the students of BPSMV, Khanpur Kalan.

The Committee in its meetings held on 13/04/2021 has given the following recommendations for grant fee concession to the needy students:-

1. The applications from eligible students for fee Concession will be received and scrutinized by the admission committee for its genuineness which will be further verified by the Chairperson/HOD/In-charge/Director/Principal at the time of admission for points 3,4,5 & 6 below.
2. If the eligible students applies for fee concession at a later stage after admission, she will apply to the departmental Head who will refer it to a departmental committee constituted for the purpose, which will scrutinize the application for its genuineness and give recommendation, which will be further verified by the Chairperson and processed for further action for points 3,4,5& 6 below.
3. Full tuition fee concession will be granted to orphan girl students dependent on other family members and 50% concession in room rent, if they seek admission to the University hostels, on submission of relevant documents.
4. Full Tuition Fee Concession will be granted to the students belonging to BPL,EWS and Single Girl Child/one of the twin sisters(having no brother or sister, elder or younger), and 50% concession in room rent, if they seek admission to the University hostels, on submission of relevant documents.
5. Tuition Fee concession may be allowed to two or more daughters of the same parents who are studying in the main university campus or any other University maintained institutions, at the following rates;
 - i. The eldest to pay Full Fee.

- ii. The younger or younger ones to pay Half Fee.
6. Full Tuition fee concession will be granted to Physically Handicapped students who have permanent disability of not less than 40%(being otherwise fit for admission to the course) and 50% concession in room rent, if they seek admission to the University hostels on submission of relevant certificate from Chief Medical Officer.
7. The Fee concession(s) shall not be allowed in courses run under Self Financing Scheme.
8. Married/unmarried girl students having family dispute/widows may also be granted full tuition fee concession and 50% concession in room rent if they seek admission to the University Hostel as a special case on the approval of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.
9. However, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor may relax any of the provisions mentioned above in exceptional circumstances.
10. Fee concessions instructions for reserved categories will be mandatorily applicable as per the notifications received from government from time to time.

The case was put up to the Vice-Chancellor who after due consideration has ordered to place the same before the Academic Council for consideration.

5. **To note the action taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to increase the sanctioned intake of B.A. course from 60 to 90 as permanent at Regional Centre Krishan Nagar, Rewari in anticipation of approval of the Academic Council.**

Statement of the case:-

B.A. course was started at Regional Centre Krishan Nagar, Rewari from the academic session 2014 -15 with an intake of 60. The admissions for the current session 2021-22 were started on 18/09/2021. On the demand of the nearby villagers and students the University increases the seats from 60 to 80 for the Academic Session 2020-20211 only. Further, the request of the nearby villagers has been received to increase the intake from 60 to 90 as permanent.

Therefore, the matter with regard to increase the sanctioned intake of B.A Course from 60 to 90 as permanent was submitted to Hon'ble Vice- Chancellor for kind consideration and the same has been considered and approved by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of Academic Council. He has further ordered to place the same before Academic Council for approval.

6. **To note the action taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to increase the sanctioned intake of B.A. course from 120 to 160 at Regional Centre, Kharal In anticipation of approval of the Academic Council.**

Statement of the case:-

B.A. course was started at Regional Centre, Kharal from the Academic Session 2014 -15 with an intake of 120. The admissions for the current session 2021-22 were started on 18/09/2021. Further, the request of the nearby villagers has been received to increase the intake from 120 to 160. As per note of the Director Regional Center, Kharal, there is no extra financial liability on the exchequer of the university.

Therefore, the matter with regard to increase the sanctioned intake of B.A Course from 120 to 160 was submitted to Hon'ble Vice- Chancellor for kind consideration and the same has been considered and approved by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of Academic Council without any financial liability. He has further ordered to place the same before Academic Council for approval.

7. **To note the action taken by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council to grant special permission to Ms. Rinku, a student of B.A. 5th semester by relaxing the condition of attendance owing to her selection on the Post of MTS in the Department of Survey of India.**

Statement of the Case:-

A request from Ms. Rinku, a student of B.A. 5th semester studying in BPS IHL, was received (**Annexure-5-, page-90**) to grant her permission to complete her course. The student was admitted in the Academic Session 2019-20 and completed four semesters. In the beginning of fifth semester she got selected on

the Post of MTS in the Department of Survey of India, therefore, she could not attend classes of 5th Semester. She requested to appear in the examination of 5th and 6th Semester during the Academic Session 2021-2022.

The case was put up to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. In view of the career prospects of the student, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor has approved the same in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council by relaxing the condition of attendance and ordered to refer the case to the Academic Council.

8. To note the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council to grant special permission to Ms. Rubi, a student of B.A. 5th semester by relaxing the condition of attendance owing to her selection on the Post of MTS in the Department of Income Tax.

Statement of the Case:-

A request from Ms. Rubi, a student of B.A. 5th semester studying in BPS IHL, was received (Annexure-6, page-91) to grant her permission to complete her course. The student was admitted in the Academic Session 2019-20 and completed four semesters. In the beginning of fifth semester she got selected on the Post of MTS in the Department of Income Tax, therefore, she could not attend classes of 5th Semester. She requested to appear in the examination of 5th and 6th Semester during the Academic Session 2021-2022.

The case was put up to the Vice Chancellor. In view of the career prospects of the student, the Vice Chancellor has approved the same in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council by relaxing the condition of attendance and ordered to refer the case to the Academic Council.

9. To note the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor to approve the Scheme and Syllabus of UG in Sociology from the Academic Session 2021-22 in anticipation of the approval of Academic Council.

Statement of the case:-

In this connection it is submitted that in reference to the memo no. DHE-02002/2/2021-College-1 DHE, dated 13/08/2021 from the office of Director General, Higher Education, Panchkula. A committee consisting of following was

proposed by the Dean of Colleges BPSMV, Khanpur Kalan has been constituted to prepare the Scheme and syllabus of UG in Sociology for the Academic Session 2021-22. A meeting of said committee was held on 13/12/2021 in the Department of Sociology, MDU, Rohtak for implementation in the Affiliated College. The following members were present:-

1. Sh. Dilbag Singh, Principal, Govt. College for Women, Sonapat.
2. Prof. (Dr.) K.S. Chauhan, Department of Sociology, MDU, Rohtak.
3. Prof. (Dr.) Mrs. Supriti, Department of Sociology, MDU, Rohtak.
4. Mr. Joginder, Assistant Prof. in Sociology, Govt. College for Women, Sonapat.

The minutes of above committee is placed at **(Annexure-7, page-92-104)**

On the request of the Principal, Govt. College for Women, Sonapat, the recommendations of the Committee were placed before the HVC wherein, in view of the academic interest of the students he has approved the same in anticipation of approval of Academic Council and further ordered to place the same before Academic Council for information.

10. **To note the action taken by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of Academic Council regarding relaxation in promotion policy of students of University for the Academic Session (2021-22).**

Statement of the case:-

The request from the students of the Departments of Pharmacy duly recommended by the Chairperson was received for granting relaxation in the promotion policy for the students of their concerned departments.

The Academic Council vide Resolution No. 3 of its meeting held on 16/12/2014 has approved the promotion policy for students placed at **(Annexure-8, Page-105-106)**. In light of this resolution, these students could not be promoted to the next semester. Earlier, on request of some students duly recommended by their concerned HODs, the above promotion policy were relaxed by the Academic Council vide Resolution No. 06 in its meeting held on 14.09.2017

(Annexure-9, page-107-108) and resolution no. 10 of the in its meeting held 21/07/2020 respectively. On the basis of the above resolution No. 06 dated 14.09.2017 and resolution no. 10 dated 21/07/2020.

The present case was put up to the higher authorities for consideration and keeping in view of the Covid situation, future of the students and vision of the University the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has granted relaxation in promotion policy for the all students of the University for the year 2021-2022 as per past practice in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council and ordered to placed it before the Academic Council for information.

11. To note the action taken by the vice chancellor to award the ph. D degree to the students in the subject as mentioned against their name in anticipation approval of the academic council.

Statement of the Case:

Following Ph. D. Scholars from various Departments had submitted their Ph. D thesis in their respective Department. For the award of degree of doctorate of philosophy the provision laid down in BPSMV Ph.D. Ordinance 2011/1 vide clause 13.3 is:

"The reports of the examiners on the thesis as well as on the viva-voce examination shall be placed before a Committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, the Dean and the Head of the Department concerned, within one month of the viva-voce examination. The Committee shall further, after considering the complete process of evaluation, recommend it to the Academic Council for final consideration and approval.

If the Dean or Head of the Department somehow is not able to participate in the meeting, the Vice-Chancellor will co-opt any other senior member of the Faculty, in his/her/ their place."

As per Statute 30 (2) the Board of Under- Graduate Studies shall consist of:

- (iii) One Reader and one Lecturer appointed or recognized by the University in the Department. to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor by rotation, according to seniority;
- (iv) Six Teachers (including Principals) of under –graduate Courses from the women college in the subject concerned, to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, by rotation, according to seniority, to be determined by the length of under graduate teaching experience ensuring that there is not more than one such member from any one College:
Provided that no such teacher shall be nominated for two consecutive terms:
Provided further that a teacher who has been nominated as a member of Faculty shall not be nominated under this sub –clause;
- (v) Two outside experts nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, on the recommendations of the Chairperson of the Department.

As per Statute 30 (3) the Board of Post- Graduate Studies shall consists of:

- (i) Chairperson of the Department
- (ii) All the Professors appointed or recognized by the University in the Department;
- (iii) Two Readers and two Lecturers appointed or recognized by the university in the Deptt., to be nominated by the V.C., by rotation, according to seniority
- (iv) Two teachers including the Heads of the Post –Graduate Departments in women colleges admitted to the privileges of the University in the subject concerned with at least ten years teaching experience,-----.
- (v) Two outside experts nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, on the recommendations of the Chairperson of the Department.

As per Statute 14, the Academic Council shall consist of:

- (iv) The Deans of Faculties;
- (v) The Dean, Students' Welfare, if any;
- (vi) The Dean, Academic Affairs;
- (vii) The Dean of Colleges;
- (viii) The Chairpersons of the Departments;
- (ix) The Chief Warden of University Hostels;
- (x) The Proctor;
- (xi) The Controller of Examinations, if any;
- (xii) The Librarian of the University Library;
- (xiii) One out of the principals of colleges maintained by the University, by rotation, provided that she is not a member of the Executive Council;
- (xiv) Professor(s) Emeritus appointed by the University/Emeritus Fellow appointed by the University Grants Commission (but without having right to vote or seek election).

II. Other members-

- (i) one professor appointed by the University from each Department, by rotation, on the basis of seniority;

- (ii) one University reader from each faculty, by rotation, on the basis of seniority;
- (iii) one University lecturer from each faculty, by rotation, on the basis of seniority;
- (iv) one principal and three teachers to be elected from amongst themselves by the principals and teachers respectively, holding their posts in substantive capacity in the colleges included in each of the constituencies mentioned below:-
 - (a) Government Colleges for Women, other than the Women Colleges of Education;
 - (b) Colleges of Education;
 - (c) Non- Government Women Colleges, other than the Women Colleges of Education, in Each of the four zones to be demarcated by the Vice-Chancellor;
Provided that not more than one teacher elected under this clause shall belong to any one college;
 - (v) five educationists of national or international eminence to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, from outside the University, provided that not more than one of them shall be from the same field;
 - (vi) three persons elected by the Court from amongst its own members;
 - (vii) president, Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya Students' Union and two presidents to be elected from amongst themselves by the presidents of the Students' Unions in the women colleges for the period from the date of election till the 31st May of the Academic Year;
- III. (i) The Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of Academic Council.

A letter No.1/4-2020 Adv./HSHEC dated 17/07/2020 has been received from the Haryana State Higher Education Council with a request "to include representative of Alumni, Profession, trade and industry in the Academic Council and Board of Studies initially as special invitee and gradually to make provision in the Statutes." **(Annexure-12, page-141-147)**

As such, there is no provision for nominating the above person in Academic Council and Board of Studies. However, as per Clause 3 of Section 23, "The

Academic Council may propose to the Executive council a draft of any Statute relating to academic matters for consideration by the Executive council."

Further as per section 23(4) every new statute or addition to the statute or amendment or repeal of statute shall require the approval of the Hon'ble Chancellor.

She has stated that she got 5th position out of 06 students with securing 720 marks out of 1100 marks. While others like the toppers one has got 818 marks of 1100 marks who was trailing much behind of me in all three semesters with almost 200 plus marks. This fact of result made me disappointed and shocked. In the 4th semester we equally attended industrial training viva, project viva, she further stated that how can a much backward student who got even re-appear in 3rd semesters crossed me with 98 marks difference and got 1st position. I am in the opinion that a huge partiality seems to be done because of Gold Medal. The result is totally unfair and further requesting that higher authorities to look into the matter and decide the things in a transparent manner.

As such the student has to complete her M.Tech. programme up to 2018-20. Ms. Sunaina Mittal has passed her all theory paper, however only dissertation left. Now after the maximum duration of the course, she put a request to pursue her M.Tech. Dissertation after expiry of maximum duration of PG programme and also submitted her family reason. The case has been recommended by the Chairperson with a request to consider the same as a special case.

The case has been put up to the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for kind consideration and order to place the same before Academic Council for approval.

The NCISM (Earlier Known as CCIM- Central Council of Indian) issued a new MSE (Minimum Standard of Education) vide notification dated 16/02/2022 (Annexure- 21, Page-261-326).

Further, NCISM has also issued the Academic Calendar for the batch 2021-22 for BAMS dated 24/02/2022 (Annexure-22, Page-327-328).

In this regard, the emergent meeting of College Council, UGBOS & Faculty of Ayurvedic Medicine were held on 26th, 27th & 28th February 2022 respectively and all the bodies resolved that said Gazette Notification and Academic Calendar be adopted in too being a mandatory guidelines to grant approval for admission in BAMS Course from apex body NCISM, Ministry of AYUSH and the matter may be put up before the next Academic Council for kind consideration. The minutes of the all bodies are also attached herewith (**Annexure- 23, Page-329-331**).

It aims to recast India's National Literacy Mission to focus on literacy of Women, and BPSMV is single Women University in North India to perform the women empowerment.

The same is the essential requirement for the purpose of NAAC accreditation. Accordingly all the HODs/Principals were requested to send the scheme and syllabi of their concerned academic programme by mentioning the above outcomes.

The same was put up to the Vice-Chancellor who after due consideration has desired to place the same before the Academic Council for consideration.

38. To note the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor with regard to constitution of Academic Planning Board, in terms of Statute 26 (1) of BPS Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, Khanpur Kalan Act 2006.

Statement of the case:-

As per Statute 26 (1) the constitution of the Academic planning board is as under: -

26 (1) The Academic Planning Board shall consist of: -

- (a) The vice chancellor;
- (b) Not more than seven persons of high standing on education who shall be appointed by the Chancellor on the recommendation of the Vice Chancellor for a term of two years;
- (c) The Registrar who shall be the Secretary to the Board.


